Smart Border Coalition Stakeholders meeting

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1. Essential consular services.

- •Shifts twice a week for issuing emergency documents + 24 x 7 emergency line.
 - Passports, consular IDs, death certificates, etc.
- •Consular support for the Mexican communities.
 - ❖ Financial assistance and visa permits for repatriation of human remains.
 - ❖ Help in finding medical homes.
 - ❖Orientation on available resources for the community regardless of their migratory status through Spanish speaking media, official website, emergency lines and "Ventanilla de Salud".
- •Promote constant binational dialogue mechanisms among local authorities, businesses, and public opinion leaders.

Positive cases: 4,319 (total)

• Around 56% are Hispanic

Deaths: 158 (total)

• Around 39% are Hispanic

2. Consular protection.

- Repatriations to Mexico
 - o 52.7% decrease
 - Sanitary COVID-19 Protocol
 - Minors and vulnerable people
- Assistance to detainees and their families in 17 federal, state and county jails
 - The Otay Mesa Detention Center case
- Special permits for border-crossing
 - Humanitarian paroles
 - Other special permits (case by case)
- Donations
 - Customs clearance and transportation











3. Reopening of consular offices.

- •Hopefully, towards the second-half of May we'll be able to reopen.
- •Sanitary measures will be strictly observed to protect both Mexican nationals and consular staff.
 - ✓ Laredo, Brownsville, Del Rio, El Paso and Denver have already reopened.
 - ✓ Backlog of 6,000 cancelled appointments during almost two months.
